The artist says, "Because Circle of Animals / Zodiac Heads is animal heads, I think it's something that everyone can have some understanding of, including children and people who are not in the art world. I think it's more important to show your work to the public. That's what I really care about. When Andy Warhol painted Mao in the 1960's and 1970's, I don't think many people understood Mao, either - it was just this image that people knew, like Marilyn Moore or somebody. So they might see these zodiac animals like that - like Mickey Mouse. They're just animals. Eleven real and one mystic animal.'

When I came across the larger than life bronze heads my experience was delight. Their impressive size and beauty can be appreciated by all just like Ai Weiwei has intended. Yet for me and those of us aligned with Chinese astrology, seeing our 'family' of animals with all their meaning and yearly proclivities held a special excitement.

Seeing the Zodiac Heads also reminds me that by the Lunar calendar we are only about 4 1/2 months into the Year of the Rabbit and that there are still so many ways to take advantage of what the year holds for each one of us. I use the yearly predications to inform the recommendations I make to my clients, both to enhance opportunities and mitigate possible dangers.

If you are in the NY metropolitan area make a point of visiting the Zodiac Heads outside Central Park. They are on a world tour and will leave on July 15th. Ai Weiwei grew up in exile, the son of a revered modern poet who was swept up in the purge of intellectuals in the late 1950's. Presently Ai Weiwei has been detained by the Chinese government and was not able to be present for the opening of his show in May. His inspiration for these heads was the Zodiac Fountain Clock and the Twelve Bronze Heads designed by European Jesuits at the Garden of Perfect Brightness the imperial retreat outside of Beijing began in the first decade of the eighteenth century.
