Business isn't growing fast enough? It's possible your corporate space needs *feng shui*—the ancient Chinese art of rearranging elements of water, wood, fire, earth and metal in a room to promote health, happiness and prosperity by allowing *chi* (energy or life force) to flow freely. "In a conference room, you want to be in a commanding position with the best view of the door, seated in a high-backed chair, at a round or oval table to foster harmony among colleagues," says *feng shui* consultant Judith Wendell, founder of design firm Sacred Currents. Even an employee's office may need an overhaul. "Clutter can block energy and hinder productivity," she warns.
